With excitement the children found the brook!




“Brook and Tuebrook sound the same”

Did you know **Tue Brook** or **Tew Brook** is a small river or stream in Liverpool. It flows through the suburb of West Derby and is the main tributary of the River Alt.

The brook is now almost entirely culverted and runs underground, but is remembered in the name of Tuebrook ward.

Once back in class the children eagerly responded to Tim Peak with a letter acknowledging their findings.
