Pupil Premium Statement

The Pupil Premium is funding which is additional to the normal school budget. It is designed to boost the attainment of disadvantaged pupils within each school and reduce the gap between the highest and lowest achievers. The amount of funding each school receives is determined by the number of pupils on roll who are eligible for free school meals. Funding is also allocated according to the number of pupils who are deemed to be 'looked after' i.e. in the care of the Local Authority. In 2012 funding was extended to include children who have been eligible for free school meals within the past 6 years. A lesser amount of funding is allocated to the children of service families.

It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility. Schools however, are to be held accountable for how they have used the additional funding to support the children from low income families.

Principles

We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all our pupils. We ensure that appropriate provision is made to support pupils who belong to vulnerable groups.

We recognise that some pupils who do not receive free school meals may have some significant barriers to learning.

We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil who has been legitimately been identified as disadvantaged or at risk of being unable to access learning effectively.

Pupil Premium will be allocated on a needs led basis, linked to analysis of outcomes for pupils.

Current Academic Year Sept 2015 – July 2016

Pupil Premium Received £82,623

The majority of the funding will be spent on employing additional staff which includes:

- Teacher to teach small withdrawal group for English & mathematics
- Numbers Counts teacher providing 1:1 support for pupils in mathematics
- Specialist language support teacher for EYFS
- Teaching assistants working with targeted groups of children on intervention programmes for literacy and numeracy
- Appointment of Learning mentor to support children and families
- Enrichment activities including music and swimming lessons for Year 1 and year 2 pupils.
- Interventions including training for adults to provide emotional support and therapies.
- Support will also be given to help families with uniform or to access to extra-curricular activities.
