English

Genre: Instructions and Information Texts - Houses and Homes

We will be learning to:

- Demonstrate how to follow a set of instructions e.g. how to print a piece of work, how to take a photograph, how to build a simple model.
- Discuss the different features of instructions e.g. title, pictures, numbers.
- Model and practise giving oral instructions using simple and consistent instructional language.
- Follow the steps in a different order to reinforce sequencing.
- Know what an imperative verb is.
- Correctly form letters
- Daily phonics lesson and high frequency word reading and spelling.
- Pie Corbett story 'The 3 Bears'
- Reading in a variety of contexts for example, whole class, small groups, individual.

You can help your child by:

Read with your child frequently and complete the homework as this supports the work we are doing in school.

Maths

Focus: Calculations including multiplication and division

We will be learning:

- Solve one-step problems involving multiplication and division, by calculating the answer using concrete objects, pictorial representations and arrays with the support of the teacher.
- Through grouping and sharing small quantities, children begin to understand: multiplication and division; doubling numbers and quantities; and finding simple fractions of objects, numbers and quantities.
- They make connections between arrays, number patterns, and counting in twos, fives and tens

You can help your child by:

Completing given homework suggested in topic homework book as this supports the work we are doing in school.

Make use of everyday maths opportunities such as counting coins, spotting odd and even numbers, counting in patterns of 2, 5, and 10.

Science - Materials

We will be learning;

- To revise the different materials learnt from the previous term eg wood, plastic, glass, metal, water, and rock
- To carry out investigations exploring the best waterproof material for a coat for the children when exploring their local area..
- To distinguish between the material and the object.
- To compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of their simple physical properties.

You can help your child by;

 Talking about, asking and answering questions about everyday materials so that they become familiar with the names of materials and properties such as: hard/soft; stretchy/stiff; shiny/dull; rough/smooth; bendy/not bendy; waterproof/not waterproof; absorbent/not absorbent; opaque/transparent.



PE -

We will be learning;

- To master basic movements including running, jumping, throwing and catching, as well as developing balance, agility and coordination, and begin to apply these in a range of activities.
- To participate in team games.
- To perform dances using simple movement patterns.

You can help your child by:

• Allowing your child to become independent with dressing and undressing themselves.

Why not sign up for an after school club this term like running club, Dance or Zumba?



Art - Sculpting

We will be learning;

- The techniques and skills needed when using clay in order to sculpt local landmarks seen following their walk in their local area.
- To develop and explore creative ideas following their personal experiences and to use their imagination to enhance their product using pattern & texture.
- To find out about famous artists; using clay/sculpting. Describing the differences and similarities between different practices and disciplines, and making links to their own work.
- To appreciate that patience and care are needed when working on long detailed projects

You can help your child by;

- Talking about buildings in the local area looking at their shape, the lines and patterns.
- Use vocabulary such as horizontal, vertical, diagonal, zig zag lines and the variety of shapes like oval, square, rectangle etc.



RE – Easter



We will be learning to:

- Explore the Easter story through story, photographs, drama and music videos.
- Begin to understand why Easter is important to Christians and why celebrations are important in religion.
- Begin to use religious words.
- Recognise religious symbols.

You can help your child by:

• Look for signs of New life in creation.

French

We will be learning to;

- Follow 'Simon Says' instructions in French.
- Use different greetings
- Say where we live
- Learn a variety of nouns related to houses and homes.

- Organise images into groups and sort images to given criteria.
- Ask and answer questions about their images.
- Revise e-safety knowledge from previous term.
