Winnie waved her wand again, and her house wasn't the same.

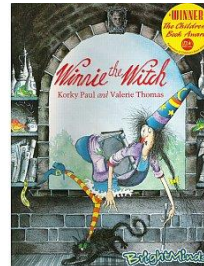
Yellow walls and a red door, Green carpet was on the floor.
