

# National Railway Safety

This term the children listened to a visitor from British Network Railways. She revised the safety messages previously shared by Mersey Rail.

What they didn't know was...

- How fast a train travels.
- How long it takes to stop.
- If a train is travelling around a bend it would not see the children.
- Electricity can not be seen or heard but is there!

The children at Lister Infants know not to play on the railway!

The children listened and learned about how to keep safe using the railway.



The children asked some really great questions...

**"How do you know who works for the railway?"**

The children learnt about safe strangers and who to turn to for help.

**"Why is there a yellow line on the platform?"**

Standing behind the yellow line is very important for many reasons. The wind turbulence and speed of a passing trains plus in winter there may be danger of ice and slipping so take care, stand behind the yellow line and hold onto the railings when getting on a train.
