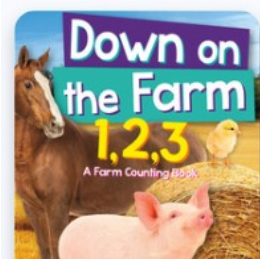
In the small world farm area, we have been developing our imaginative play as we use the animals to act out the stories we have read together.
