We have also been learning the names of baby animals.

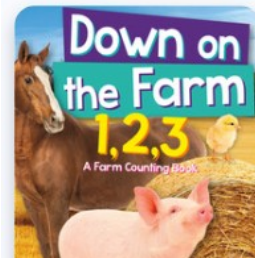
In the small world farm area we have been developing our imaginative play as we use the animals to create stories.
