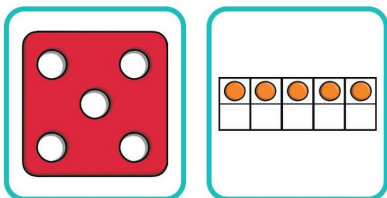


This Week.....

In maths, we have been learning all about the number 5. We have enjoyed solving number 5 problems and discussing the different ways we can make 5.



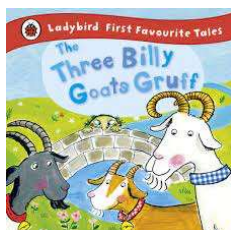
