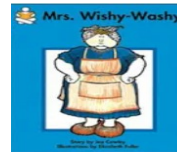

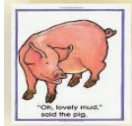
Story of the Week



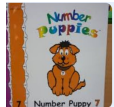

During number work the children have been learning about the number two. They have been writing the number two and finding the amount to make two. The children also enjoyed listening to a story called "Number Puppy 2."

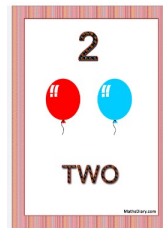


Sun Hats
