### Lost School Coat

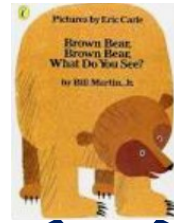


One of our children has lost his school coat. Please check inside the lining of your child's coat for a name. The lost coat says "Lennon". If you find it, please return it to the Nursery.

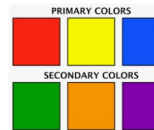
