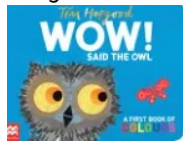


This week the children continued with the “Wow! Said the Owl” story. They were amazing at ordering pictures from the story and retelling the story too.

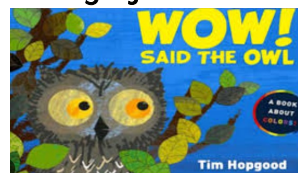
Half Term
