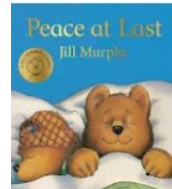

The children have started to learn the songs for their Christmas Sing-along. Please encourage your child to practise singing them at home. Your child has been given a copy of the songs to help them to practise.

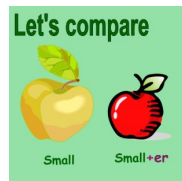
Magical Moments

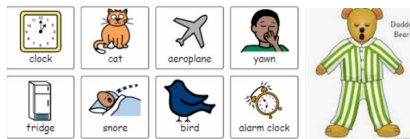
They also were brilliant at saying what things a baby needed.
