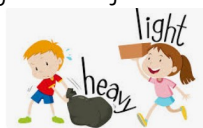


This week Nursery have been wonderful at settling back into their Nursery routine after the Christmas Holiday.

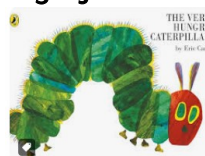
