During number work the children have been learning about the number three. They have been writing the number three and finding the amount to make three. The children also enjoyed listening to a story called "Number Puppy 3."




Nursery also enjoyed celebrating VE Day. Nursery had a little party and danced to music from the 1940's. Nursery also performed a dance with the whole school too.
