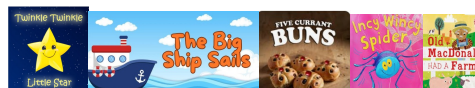

Home Learning Challenge



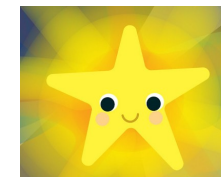
