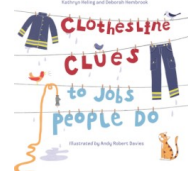

### World Book Day



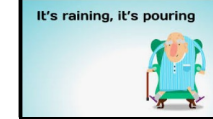
