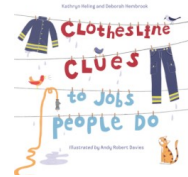
Next week we are celebrating British Science Week and Nursery are looking forward to taking part in lots of fun science experiments.

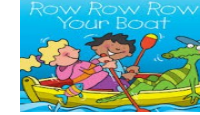
This week the children have enjoyed participating in World Book Day. If your child has a favourite story book then share this at home, or join the local library and see what lovely stories they have to take home and share.
